How does rainfall affect our environment and people's lives?

What are the four stages of the water cycle?

evaporation, condensation, precipitation and collection.

What happens to the water when it reaches the ground?

When rainwater lands it will either infiltrate the soil or will travel downwards until it reaches streams, rivers and eventually the sea.

VOCABULARY

river: a large natural channel of water

valley: a long, low area of land, often with a stream or river running

through it, surrounded by higher ground

infiltration: the process by which water enters the soil

Science - States of Matter

What conditions are needed for different materials to change state?

What is a state of matter?

Matter is any substance that has mass and takes up space (volume).

What are the 3 states of matter?

Solid: having a firm shape or form that can be measured.

Liquid: in a form that flows easily

Gas: a form of matter that is neither liquid nor solid

VOCABULARY

Evaporate: to turn from liquid into gas

Condense: change from a gas to a liquid or solid through cooling.

Precipitate: water released from the clouds which falls to the ground as rain,

snow or sleet.
