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





RWI readers – read the book at least 3 times. 1x decoding, 2x fluency, 3x comprehension and understanding


Accelerated readers – Read the book and when confident bring the book back to school and complete the quiz (at school)

Please reading folders in daily. Remind your child to take their book and reading record out of their bag and place it in the box on Mrs Watts' desk when it needs changing.


