



Reading at home – read your book 3 times then bring the book into be changed.


A maths KIRF will come home on Friday to support the following week's learning.

Reading books can be brought back any day each week to be changed




Reading Records

As well as reading for pleasure in their heads or with you, it is also important for children to read aloud to an adult to practise their fluency and to talk about what they have read.


