

Geography—Who lives in Antarctica?	
F A C T S	What are the seven continents? <i>The 7 continents are Europe, Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Australasia and Antarctica</i>
	How does the interior of Antarctica compare to its coastal regions? <i>The interior region of Antarctica is extremely cold and has little snowfall. The coastal areas of Antarctica are milder (though still extremely cold) than the interior and have more precipitation.</i>
V	continent: <i>any of the seven large and continuous land masses that constitute most of the dry land on the surface of the Earth</i>
O C	ice shelf: <i>a thick mass of ice covering coastal land and extending out over the sea so that the extended portion floats</i>
a b	glacier: <i>a large body of accumulating ice and compacted snow, formed in valleys or at the poles, that slowly moves and changes under its own weight</i>

F A C T S	What temperature does water freeze at? <i>0 °C</i>

V	Environment: <i>everything that surrounds a particular type of living thing and affects its growth and health.</i>
O C	Classify: <i>to group or order.</i>

F A C T S	What is the difference between mono and relief printing? Mono <i>form of printmaking that has lines or images that can only be used once.</i> Relief <i>is a type of printing where a printing block is used to make a mark on paper.</i>
	Who was William Morris? <i>19th century designer of wallpaper and tapestry who became famous for printing repeating patterns in his designs.</i>
V	print: <i>an indentation or mark made on a surface</i>
O C	overlay: <i>different materials used to add colour and texture to a print.</i>
a b	Indentation: <i>a dent in a surface</i>
