

Religious Education – Jewish Faith
<i>Why is the torah important to Jewish people?</i>
<p>What are the important objects for Jewish people? There are many important objects for Jewish people, e.g. mezuzah, challah loaf, kippah, Star of David.</p> <p>What do Jewish people believe about God? Jews believe that God is one and that it is important to love God.</p> <p>What are the festivals celebrated by Jewish people? Jewish families celebrate a range of festivals including Sukkot. They celebrate Shabbat every week.</p>
<p>Orthodox-Jews who adhere strictly to traditional beliefs and practices</p> <p>Progressive-Jews who reconcile their faith with modern life.</p> <p>Shabbat– Day of rest (from sunset on Friday until sunset on Saturday).</p> <p>Torah- First part of the Jewish Bible, containing the 5 books of Moses</p>

<p>What do we mean by creativity? the use of imagination or original ideas to create something- inventiveness.</p> <p>What is improvisation? An imaginative piece created spontaneously or without preparation.</p> <p>What is unison? A dance where everyone in a group completes the same movements at the same time, in the same way.</p>

<p>Sequence: a set of related events, movements, or items that follow each other in a particular order.</p> <p>Interconnection: The physical, non-verbal communication between dancers to organise synchronized or co-ordinated dances.</p>

Geography– Populations
<i>Why do people change where they live?</i>
<p>What is a population explosion? Where the population of a place grows very quickly.</p> <p>What are birth and death rates? The amount of people born in a country vs the amount of people that die gives the number of people in that population.</p> <p>Give a definition of migration. Migration is the movement of people from one location to another. It can be temporary or permanent, within a country or to a different country.</p>
<p>Birth rate- the number of live births per 1000 population per year.</p> <p>Death rate- the number of deaths per 1000 per year.</p> <p>Life expectancy- the number of years a person is expected to live, usually taken from birth.</p> <p>Natural increase- birth rate higher than death rate: birth rate minus death rate.</p>

Science - Life Cycles

<i>Why are life cycles important to living things?</i>

<p>What is a life cycle? Life cycles are the various stages within a living things development (plants and animals) and involve growth, development stages and reproduction.</p> <p>What conditions support growth in plants? Warmth, water and soil.</p> <p>Can you name some key pollinators? Bees, wasps, butterflies, birds, other insects and the wind.</p>

<p><u>VOCABULARY</u></p> <p>Germination—The process of a seed developing into a plant.</p> <p>Pollination—The transfer of pollen from a male part of a plant to a female part of a plant to produce seeds.</p> <p>Metamorphosis– The process, after birth, where an animal changes the physical structure of its body.</p>
