A motif is a design or shape that can be repeated to make a pattern. Block printing uses a carved or engraved surface to create an image.</p>
<p>Nocturnal An animal that is awake during the night and asleep during the day.  Diurnal An animal that is awake in the day and sleeps at night.  Habitat – A habitat is the natural place something lives. A habitat provides living things with everything they need to survive such as food, shelter and water.  Microhabitat – A microhabitat is a very small habitat in places like under a rock, under leaves or on a branch. Minibeasts live in microhabitats.
