Vocab	<b>Eternal-</b> Existing forever, without end. <b>Creation-</b> The concept of everything being created by God. <b>Evolution-</b> The change of species over time by selection.

Facts	<b>What is physical geography?</b> Physical geography is the natural features of the environment such as trees, fields, rivers and streams. <b>What is human geography?</b> Human geography is man made features of the environment such as buildings, roads and playgrounds.	
Vocab	<b>Environment</b> – The natural world around us. <b>Locality</b> – An area of a country or city. <b>Grid reference</b> – The 4 or 6 grid coordinates that identifies a place.

Facts	<b>What are hormones?</b> Hormones are chemical messengers that work throughout your body in different ways to help you grow and change.	
	<b>When does puberty start?</b> Usually between 8 and 13, it is different for everyone.	
Vocab	<b>What happens to our bodies as we get older?</b> Muscles tend to lose strength, endurance and flexibility. Wrinkles may start to appear on the face and hair colour will turn to grey.	
	<b>Puberty-</b> How bodies change and develop during adolescence.	
	<b>Relationships-</b> The way in which people are connected and behave towards one another.	
	<b>Hygiene-</b> Keeping clean to be healthy.

Facts	<b>What is observational drawing?</b> Observational drawing is a drawing you see in front of you, made as realistic as possible.	
	<b>What makes a good observational drawing?</b> Good drawings show detail, shadow, contour, depth and perspective.	
Vocab	<b>Contours-</b> An outline representing the boundary of a shape.	
	<b>Perspective–</b> The art of representing a 3D object on a 2D surface.	
	<b>Realistic–</b> Representing a drawing in a way that is accurate and true to life.
