What is money?	
FACTs	<b>Where does money come from?</b> People can earn money by working or they might receive money as a gift or support from a charity.
	<b>How can we keep money safe?</b> In our houses we can keep money in a wallet/purse, money box or safe. Money we earn from jobs are usually looked after in a bank.
Vocab	<b>Money</b> - Coins/cash that people use to buy goods and services.
	<b>Electronic payment</b> - Paying for goods or services using credit/debit cards/bank transfers or internet applications.

People, Culture and Communities/Religious Education	
Where do we belong?	
FACTs	<b>What groups do people belong to outside of school?</b> Rainbows, badgers, dance club, swimming club, musical theatre.
	<b>What religious groups have we learnt about at school?</b> Charlie is Jewish, he observes Shabbat. Nathan is Christian, he prays to God, reads the bible and goes to church.
Vocab	<b>Belonging</b> - People belong to families, groups, and communities; belonging means being welcomed, included, and valued.
	<b>Community</b> - Families, schools, and religious groups are communities where people care for and support one another.

How do human and animal bodies change over time?	
FACTs	<b>What is the life cycle of a human?</b> The life cycle of a human is baby, toddler, child, teenager, adult, elderly.
	<b>What is the life cycle of a butterfly?</b> The life cycle of a butterfly is egg, larva (caterpillar), pupa (chrysalis) and an adult butterfly.
Vocab	<b>Life cycle</b> A life cycle is the series of stages a living thing goes through.
	<b>Offspring</b> The children of people, or the young babies of animals and plants.
Expressive Arts and Design/Art	
How can I use clay to make a structure?	
FACTs	<b>How can clay be shaped?</b> Clay can be pinched, rolled and pressed to make shapes.
	<b>How can you draw features on clay?</b> You can use tools to score (scratch) the clay.
Vocab	<b>Sculpture</b> Art that is 3D and can be seen from all sides.
	<b>Clay</b> A soft, natural material that can be shaped with your hands.
